Christmas in English-speaking countries

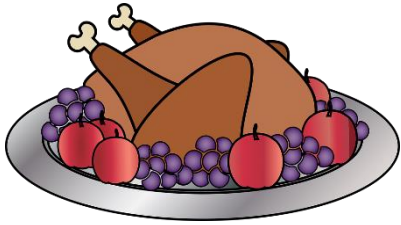
The United Kingdom

Food: The traditional Christmas dinner consists of a main course and a dessert. The main course is a roasted turkey with vegetables and sauces while for dessert they have what is called a Christmas pudding. But don't be fooled by the name, this Christmas pudding has nothing to do with our typical Czech pudding (as you can see in the picture on the right).



Presents: Children receive presents in their stockings, as you can see on the left, from Father Christmas. These presents are then opened on Christmas Day (25th December). It is more typical that children wait till late morning or early afternoon, but some cannot wait and start ripping open their presents much sooner.

The United States of America



Food: The centre of the traditional American Christmas dinner is usually turkey or ham, which are eaten with potatoes on the side. There are also lots of desserts, such as pies or cookies.

Presents: Children hang up stockings before going to bed on Christmas Eve (24th December). They also leave milk and cookies for Santa Claus, who comes through the chimney to fill their stockings and put presents under the Christmas tree. Children then open their presents on Christmas Day (25th December) morning, usually still wearing their pyjamas.



Australia



Food: The traditional meal is very similar to the UK and the USA, but what is special to Australia is that some Australians like to eat their Christmas meal at midday on the beach. They have a picnic, or they can even barbeque. This is because Christmas in Australia is very hot. That is also why when you go to the beach, you can often see people surfing while

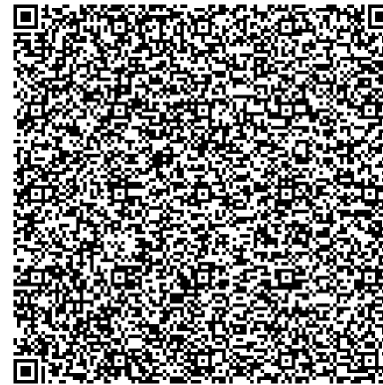
wearing a Santa Claus costume. It can be quite surprising for some tourists who don't know this tradition!
